



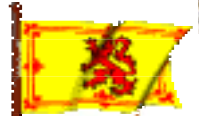
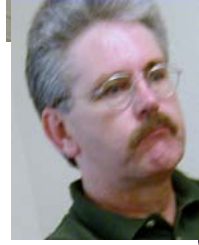
**PRESIDING** Lion President Jim McLaughlin presided and Lion Roy Minor offered the invocation.

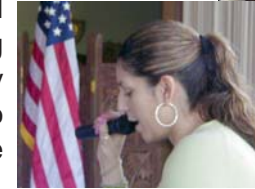
