Lion Pearl Director introduced our speaker, Dr. Harvey J. Cohen, Chief of Staff and of Pediatrics at Lucile Packard Children's Hospital.



Dr. Cohen is one of those truly amazing individuals whose convictions have led him to serve the commonweal and whose abilities are an ample match for his convictions. He has made sustained contributions to pediatric research, practice and training over a career that spans some four decades. And yet, he somehow makess the time to come and teach us something of the triumphs and challanges of pediatric medicine at the beginning of the twenty-first century.

Dr. Cohen began by listing a whole series of childhood desieses and conditions that were major problems 50 years ago, that we routinely cure or correct today. The recitation was impressive. But then he reminded us of all those problems where medicine has made little or no headway - why children continue to suffer - why Lucile Packard is busier than ever.

Finally, he moved on the promice of the immeidate future. While progress is being made on many fronts, Dr. Cohen singled out genetics and the molecular biology of protiens as areas that will have a tremendous impact on pediatric medicine over the next few decades, giving us far greater active control over the biochemistry of the immune system and of bodily tissues and organs. 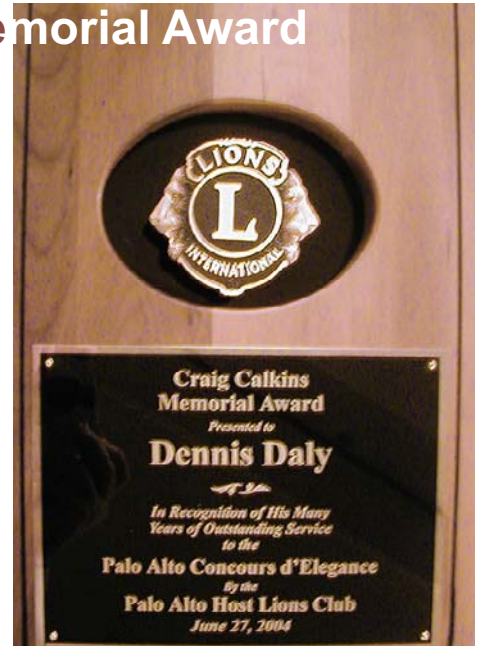
